

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT

This is Tandragee Junior High School's Publication Scheme on information available under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

The governing body is responsible for maintenance of this scheme.

Introduction: What a publication scheme is and why it has been developed:

One of the aims of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (which is referred to as FOIA in the rest of this document) is that public authorities, including all maintained schools, should be clear and proactive about the information they will make public.

To do this we must produce a publication scheme, setting out -

- **The classes of information which we publish or intend to publish;**
- **The manner in which the information will be published; and**
- **Whether the information is available free of charge or on payment.**

The scheme covers information already published and information which is to be published in the future. All information in our publication scheme is available in paper form.

Some information which we hold may not be made public, for example personal information.

This publication scheme conforms to the model scheme for schools approved by the Information Commissioner.

Aims and Objectives:

The school promotes positive attitudes to learning so that each child develops his/her full potential.

The school aims to:

- encourage pupils to be inquisitive about the world around them and to develop openness to new experiences.
- help pupils acquire knowledge and skills necessary to everyday living.
- develop the pupils' ability to discuss, analyse, reach decisions and apply themselves to tasks, thus creating a sense of purpose and ambition.
- develop the ability to communicate effectively through listening, speaking, reading and writing.
- develop individuality, independence, self-confidence and the ability to regard oneself critically.
- develop tolerance, awareness of others and the ability to respect values and opinions that may differ from one's own.
- develop a sense of responsibility to and caring for others, helping the pupils to realise that we are all interdependent.

In short the school aims to prepare pupils to live an active balanced life and to enable them to advance into mature adulthood conscious of Christian values and their responsibilities to God, their families and the wider community. This publication scheme is a means of showing how we are pursuing these aims.

Categories of information published:

The publication scheme guides you to information which we currently publish (or have recently published) or which we will publish in the future. This is split into categories of information known as 'classes'. These are contained in section 6 of this scheme.

The classes of information that we undertake to make available are organised into four broad topic areas -

- **School Prospectus** – information published in the school prospectus.
- **Governors' Documents** – information published in the Governors Annual Report and in other governing body documents.
- **Pupils & Curriculum** – information about policies that relate to pupils and the school curriculum.
- **School Policies and other information related to the school** - information about policies that relate to the school in general.

Careers Education Policy:	Statement of the programmes of careers education provided for Key 3.

Pupil Discipline:	Statement of general principles on behaviour and discipline and of measures taken by the head teacher to prevent bullying.

Staff Conduct, Discipline and Grievance:	Statement of procedure for regulating conduct and discipline of school staff and procedures by which staff may seek redress for grievance.
Curriculum circulars and statutory instruments:	Any statutory instruments, departmental circulars and administrative memoranda sent by the Department of Education to the head teacher or governing body relating to the curriculum.
Annex A - Other Documents:	Annex A provides a list of other documents that are held by the school and are available on request.
